

Rules

-No one is to leave the campgrounds without the permission of the camp director. All property outside the camp is private property and trespassing is not allowed.

**-Alcoholic beverages, narcotics, firearms, or fireworks are NOT permitted on campus!
Smoking or the use of tobacco in any form is not permitted!**

-Radios or tape players are not to be brought unless they are to be used in talent programs. These are to be labeled and turned in to the camp office for safekeeping. Please respect the rights of others by keeping noise to a minimum during rest and sleep periods.

-No cell phone use by any camper at any time unless given permission by counselor.

-If cars are brought onto the campground, they are to be parked in designated areas and are not to be driven back and forth during the week.

-Use of motorcycles and motor bikes is restricted to arrival and departure. Go carts, skateboards, roller skates, or anything harmful to the safety of the participants may not be used on the campus.

-Use of profanity is NOT permitted.

-Campers must maintain respect for other campers. **Absolutely no teasing or bullying will be permitted!**

-Pets are NOT to be brought to camp.

-Damage to camp property will be charged to those persons responsible. Fire extinguishers are provided in each cabin for emergency use only. Discharging a fire extinguisher for any other purpose will result in a cleanup fee of \$25.00 and a recharging fee of \$25.00.

-Doors and windows should be kept closed in building with air conditioning is on. Lights should be turned off in rooms that are not in use.

-Males and females are not allowed in each other's cabins.

-No excessively tight clothing

-No boys will wear earrings. No body piercing allowed

-Each camper must be in their cabin by 10:00pm and all showers taken by 11:00

-Visitors are welcome, but must abide by camp rules.

Dress Code

Camp Hallelujah Trail is a Christian camp. Guests are expected to dress reflecting a Christian example. Counselors, parents, and church leaders are responsible for the dress of the campers they bring. Bring appropriate clothing for worship and recreation. Moderate length shorts (**no shorter than 1 inch above the knee**) may be worn for activities. Tank tops, halter tops, see-through clothing, or clothing that exposes the midriff are not to be worn. Shoes are to be worn at all times when not sleeping. Dresses for girls and pants for boys must be worn to all chapel services. Dresses must be below the knee or longer. Unacceptable dress will be reported for correction.

There is one phone at the camp. This phone is for business and emergency calls only. Campers should take care of all personal calls before coming to camp. If in the case you need to get a hold of a child for any emergency reasons, please contact the park front office and they will notify us. Your child will be able to use the phone if an emergency does occur.

Well planned, nutritious meals are prepared and served in an air conditioned dining hall. Meal times are breakfast 8:00 am, lunch 12:00 pm, and supper as scheduled by camp director. Campers are encouraged to eat well and drink plenty of liquids. Special diets for campers should be brought to the attention of the camp hostess prior to the beginning of the camp.

Campers are urged to carefully check to be sure everything he/she brought to the camp is taken home when leaving. In the event a camper forgets some personal item such as clothing, shoes, luggage, etc. upon leaving the camp, he/she should call the camp to determine if the item has been found and then make arrangements to retrieve the item. All items left at the camp are held for several weeks. To give the owner an opportunity to claim them.

In the event a registration must be canceled, the cancellation request must be made in writing or by phone no later than one week prior to the first day of camp. However, registrations may be transferred to previously unregistered campers. Please be courteous and tell us if you are not coming.

The gates at Camp Hallelujah Trail will be open from 7:00 am until 10:00 pm for all scheduled events. At other times, the hours will be from 8:00 am until 5:00 pm. The gates will be locked at all other hours for security reasons. Unless a scheduled program is in session, the gates will be locked all day Sunday. Camp or retreat directors will be responsible for keeping the gate after 10:00 pm. The speed limit of 20 mph shall be observed and enforced. Automobiles and any other mode of transportation will be parked in the campers' parking lot across the street from the dining hall while camp is in session. Vehicles will not be allowed in the cabin area except for delivery and pickup of campers and luggage. The parking lot and drive parallel to the dining hall are reserved for delivery trucks and staff parking ONLY! Firearms will not be permitted. No fireworks will be permitted at any time.
